

The Louisiana Endowment for the Humanities has awarded a grant to the Acadian Memorial for Ensemble Encore: The Acadian Memorial Multi-Media Archive. Your generous donation has provided the matching funds needed for this grant.

Historian Dr. Carl Brasseaux and multi-media developer Chris Allain are

now hard at work on the archive, which will interpret the Acadian migration to Louisiana and expand the Wall of Names into an electronic format, offering a portfolio for each of Louisiana's arriving Acadian exiles. This first phase of the archive should be complete in December of 1998, when it will be promoted in a tour of Louisiana libraries.

The archive will be available to the public at the Memorial's history center and through our website. Our long term goal is to include additional generations of Acadians and expanded information on life in and people of early Louisiana.

is to prepare the building for renovations needed to house a multi-cultural interpretive center. Here visitors will be oriented to the Acadian Memorial and learn the history of other cultures important to Southwest Louisiana. At press time Mayor Eric Martin is requesting the additional funds needed to complete these renovations from the St. Martinville City Council.

Richard Laurin, a former guide at our twin site, the Grand-Pré National Historic Site in Nova Scotia, gave a talk at the Memorial on March 13. About 40 people attended his presentation on Acadian history and heritage travel. Laurin is working with Le Rêve Canadien, a receptive tour company, to offer trips to historical or ancestral sites tailored to a given group's interest.

Plans are in the works, for a staff

exchange with Grand-Pré. Docent Ed Laviolette and myself will request a trip to Grand-Pré and other historical sites and centers in the Canadian Maritimes to better interpret the Canadian viewpoint on Acadian history at the Memorial, and to provide the Grand-Pré staff with information on Louisiana Acadians. Donna Doucet, Supervisor at Grand-Pré, is asking her governing entity to send members of the Grand-Pré staff to the Memorial for the Congrès Mondial Acadien-Louisiane 1999.

Something of an Acadian equivalent of The Diary of Anne Frank, La Butte is a work of historical fiction written for young audiences. It is based on René "Pétard" Sere (Cyr), an actual Acadian who, like many families, lived in hiding in the woods for several years to evade British troops. Especially moving are Léger's young characters, who are forced to pass their formative years as invisibly as possible.

to Louisiana.
