

Milestones for the Memorial: The Cardinal and The Woodworker

The Cardinal



November 10, 1998, was a remarkable day at the Acadian Memorial when Cardinal Pio Laghi, prelate of the Roman Catholic Church and representative of Pope John Paul II, arrived to bestow a very special blessing on the Wall of Names.

His Eminence was in the Diocese of Lafayette by invitation of Bishop Edward O'Donnell to help celebrate the 80th anniversary of the founding of the Diocese and as part of the diocesan program in anticipation of the Third Millennium of Christianity.

Amid a round of official visits to Catholic schools and churches, the visit to the Acadian Memorial and the blessing of the Wall of Names was the only secular activity engaged in by the Cardinal on his six-day tour of the Lafayette area.

"Bless this wall, dedicated to the memory of these brothers and sisters of ours who were pioneers in the founding of the Acadian culture," Cardinal Laghi said before a room packed with people at the Acadian Memorial. "May all those who see the wall remember with gratitude the hard work and perseverance of these men and women that have brought us this far by faith."

Jane G. Bulliard, Chairman of the Wall of Names Committee, thanked the Cardinal for taking the time to come to the Acadian Memorial. She remarked in part, "I never dreamed, and I am sure these exiles never dreamed, that one day they would be so honored as to have their symbolic reunion blessed by a Prince of the Church."

She also noted that a Capuchin priest, Fr. Jean-François Civrey, who is depicted on the mural, was the only priest assigned to travel with a group of Acadian settlers when they were sent to the Attakapas country in 1765. "So our ties to the Holy Mother Church are long and strong indeed," she concluded.

"This is our Grand-Pré," said Lafayette woodworker John Allen LeBlanc, as the scale-model he made of the Acadian Memorial building was unveiled at the State Capitol in Baton Rouge on Wednesday, April 14, 1999. The ceremony, which took place on the ground floor of the capitol between the Senate and House committee room wings, marked another effort to recognize the Acadian Memorial as an important Louisiana site for visitors to the state.

Patricia Resweber, a cofounder of the Acadian Memorial with Janie Bulliard, commented on the importance of the location of LeBlanc's model and the accompanying exhibit being displayed in the State capitol, which she said would go a long way toward promoting the actual site in St. Martinville. "It's here next to displays of the Cabildo and State Capitol history, among others," said Resweber, "this tells people that this is what they need to see in Louisiana - this location


puts us in that league."

John and his wife, Shirley, are supporters of the Acadian Memorial and this model was John's tribute to their Acadian ancestry. His Acadian forebear who came to Louisiana was Olivier LeBlanc, who arrived aboard *La Bergere* in 1785 and settled in what is now West Baton Rouge Parish. Her Acadian ancestor in Louisiana was Pierre Armand Thibodeaux who was here in 1765.

A display accompanying the scale-model explains the elements of the Acadian Memorial: the Mural, the Wall of Names, the Eternal Flame and "Ensemble Encore - Together Again", the media archive available in the second-floor history center at the Memorial building.

The model and display is available for viewing daily at the Captiol, 8 a.m. through 5 p.m. and is fully handicap accessible. There is no admission charge.

From the President


This is the year of FrancoFête, a state wide celebration of three hundred years of the French presence in Louisiana and the Acadian Memorial is feeling its impact. Visitation increases daily and visitors from Francophone countries appreciate being able to converse in their native tongue at the Memorial and elsewhere in St. Martinville.

A big event during this FrancoFête year will be the Congrès Mondial Acadien - Louisiane 1999, the Acadian World Congress in Louisiana, which will take place the first two weeks in August. This is the counterpart of the Acadian Congress held in New Brunswick, Canada, in 1994, that was so well attended by visitors from Louisiana.

We are anticipating an increased visitor volume in St. Martinville and particularly at the Acadian Memorial so we are sending out a plea for docent help during those two weeks. To prepare voulunteers, Acadian Memorial Director Jolene Adam will hold training workshops in June and July. Please call the Acadian Memorial, 318/394-2258 if you can give this much needed support.

See the calendar enclosed noting the events planned at the Memorial during Congrès Mondial. In particular, circle the date of the 1999 Foundation fundraiser, Thursday, August 12, when we will sponsor the premiere performance in Acadiana of Evangeline: The Musical, in Concert. Based on the poem, Evangeline, the play was written by Baton Rouge playwright and actor Jamie Wax with music by Paul Taranto. This memorable evening of Broadwaystyle music will be presented in concert on stage at the Heymann Performance Arts Center in Lafayette and tickets will be available through Ticketmaster and at the Heymann Center. This is a great opportunity to support the Acadian Memorial while being entertained at a major event of Congrès Mondial.

Another event which the Foundation is supporting is the Congrès Mondial Official French Closing Mass at St. Martin de Tours Church, on August 14th. The midnight Mass will conclude a day-long schedule of events in St. Martinville and will begin at 11 p.m. with a procession of the Family Name flags into church. This Mass, at the

Mother Church of the Acadians, will mark the beginning of the end of the 1999 world celebration of Acadian/Cajun family reunions.

You will receive a notice by mail for the annual membership meeting to be held June 15th in the Conference Room on the second floor of the Acadian Memorial. At that time you will be presented a slate of officers on which to vote and have the opportunity for input in the workings and the mission of the Foundation. Please plan to be with us.

Memorial Highlights

The Acadian Memorial was recently awarded the first Small Museum Matching Grant offered by the Office of State Museum. The Memorial will receive \$40,000 to be applied toward audio tour equipment, an orientation video about the Acadian Memorial and another longer version to market. Channel One Video of Lafayette has been given a contract to produce the video.

Congrès Gardens

Area garden clubs have gathered information for those who want to celebrate the Congrès Mondial by planting flowers that will bloom in the colors of the Acadian flag: blue, red, white and yellow. Suggestions for the respective colors are, blue phlox, butterfly lily, plumbago or vinca; red begonia, hibiscus, ornamental pepper, salvia; white globe amaranth, caladium, coleus, impatiens; yellow daylilies, marigold,

sunflower or zinnia.

First Acadian in Louisiana?

Stephen White, noted genealogist from the University of Moncton, Canada, will speak at the Acadian Memorial on August 11th. He has indicated that he has information about "du premier Acadien à s'etablier en Louisiane", the first Acadian in Louisiana, whom he identifies as Joseph de Goutin de Ville, native of Port-Royal who appears in Louisiana records in 1745 and 1747. We will hear his interesting theory concerning M.Goutin.
