Jaycees pledge funds for Memorial flame

The Acadian Memorial's eternal flame moved one step closer to becoming a reality in April.

Martha Hebert, program chairman for the St. Martinville Jaycees, presented a \$2,500 check to Teddy Eastin and Ben Breaux, members of the Eternal Flame committee, and Mayor Eric Martin at a city council meeting back in April.

Hebert said the remaining \$2,500 will be collected from other Jaycee clubs around the state who want to help sponsor the flame.

She said the St. Martinville Jaycees will ask other clubs to pledge money so that the eternal flame could be sponsored by Jaycees.

"This (the flame) will memorialize the efforts of those who didn't make it," said Mayor Martin, referring to Acadians who lost their lives traveling by ship from Nova Scotia. "Those Acadians will be remembered through this eternal flame."

"It's nice to see the people giving back to the community," the Mayor added.

The project also includes a mural which depicts the heritage of the Acadians and is expected to generate an increase in tourism throughout the parish.

According to Mayor Martin, the Acadian Memorial could become another "Evangeline Oak" for St. Martinville.

The Acadian Memorial is a commemorative project honoring Acadians who were exiled from Nova Scotia in 1755 and found refuge in Louisiana.

Sonnier figure added to mural

A consolidated effort by members of several branches of the Sonnier family resulted in the representation of their common ancestor, Joseph Sonnier, on the Acadian Memorial mural. The mural figure is a composite of the children of Basile Sonnier, Sr., as they appear in a family photograph dated 1898.

Eddie Richard, who spearheaded the donation effort, presented a \$2,000 check on behalf of Catherine Mouton, Annette A. Mouton, Nelwyn P. Babineaux, Woodly Credeur, Verdie S. Guidry, Hector Sonnier, Louise Sonnier, Mildred S. Arceneaux and Floyd Sonnier of Scott; Saul Sonnier, Nellie Broussard, Patsy Sonnier and Gladys P. Thibodeaux of Lafayette and Rosalie R. Meaux of Abbeville.

This joint donation is representative of the true Acadian spirit of working together to preserve the culture and heritage of their ancestors.

Mural figure sponsored as memorial

The Acadian Memorial mural committee has received a contribution to sponsor another figure and others are still available according to

chairperson Carole Lancon.

The family of Una Blanchard Felterman had sought a lasting memorial for her since her death in 1979 and sponsoring the figure of Anselme Blanchard was the answer to their search. Mrs. Felterman, whose parents died when she was twelve years old, was raised by a brother but always thought of herself as an orphan.

A granddaughter's idea of researching and compiling a family tree for her led to the discovery of Mrs. Felterman's lineal descent from Anselme Blanchard, an Acadian refugee who arrived in Louisiana in 1767. Through the years Blanchard became a respected citizen and in 1785, when other exiles arrived, he was engaged to represent the Spanish government in settling them. He also served as a captain under General Galvez in the American Revolutionary War.

Mrs. Felterman's great pride in being recognized as a descendant of Anselme Blanchard at the 1976 dedication of a plaque in the state capitol made sponsorship of the mural figure an obvious and appropriate choice.
