

Mural to be first element of the Memorial installed

Directors of the newly formed Acadian Memorial Foundation, Inc. tell of plans to install the Robert Dafford mural, "The Arrival of the Acadians in Louisiana" as the first element of the Memorial and have set October 28th as the date for its premiere showing.

This event will also be a major fundraising effort aimed at completing the subscription of the 1440 mural squares originally available and raising additional funds to continue work on the building.

As a work of art, the mural will be a Louisiana treasure. It has received support in the form of grants from the State Arts Council, the Louisiana Divison of the Arts and the Acadiana Arts Council where it was judged to have "high artistic merit", was "historically and culturally significant", and "well planned and designed". The Foundation will be proud to display the distinctive logos of these prestigious organizations.

At a cost of \$35,000, financing the mural was made possible through donations received from the Arts grants and from persons across the United States, Canada and France. Their common

desire was to share in this masterful tribute to a courageous and valiant people and to use it as a unique opportunity to memorialize loved ones and to remember particular Acadian ancestors.

Other elements, a Wall of Names and an Eternal Flame, will be in place by the end of this year, according to Patricia Resweber, co-chair of the project. She added that the opening of an Acadian/Cajun Research Center on the second floor of the building is projected for 1996.

Three more mural figures receive sponsors

•Joseph Broussard, dit "Beausoleil"

Forty-seven descendants of Jean Camille Broussard and his wife Ada Hebert Broussard contributed to the support of the figure of Joseph Broussard dit "Beausoleil", their grandfather six times removed who is depicted on the Acadian Memorial mural. The family was represented at the memorial mass on August 15th by the persons, in picture at right, shown flanking the wreath presented at the mass which featured the names of all thirty-three mural figures.

Charles Dugas, dit "Charlit"

Charles Dugas, dit "Charlit", was married to Marguerite Broussard, a daughter of "Beausoleil" and his wife, Agnes Thibodeau. Through the support of Christy Dugas Maraist, their grand-daughter five times removed, a figure representing Dugas will be added to the mural. Mrs. Maraist's donation was made to honor her father, Mr. Clet Dugas a longtime farmer of St. Martin Parish, Louisiana. The mural figure will be a composite of Mr. Dugas, his son Gerald and his grand-son, David Maraist, Jr.

•Father Jean-Francois de Civrey

Acadian National Holiday celebrated at "Mother Church of the Acadians"

Broussard, Dugas, Father de Civrey and thirty other mural figures were represented on a wreath ceremoniously carried and presented at a special mass on August 15, 1995, the Feast of the Assumption, also the Acadian National Holiday, at St. Martin de Tours Catholic Church in St. Martinville, Louisiana. This church was designated "Mother Church of the Acadians" in 1972.

Information provided by Mr. A.J. LeBlanc of the Acadian Village in Lafayette, Louisiana, tells that this holiday was established in July 1881, when 5,000 Acadian delegates from the church parishes of the provinces of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, and Quebec, assembled at St. Joseph College in Memremcook, New Brunswick. Known as the First National Convention, this assembly was called to revive an interest in their heritage and had as one of its principal interests the choice of a national feast day for the Acadians. The purpose was to give them a separate and distinctive feast day which could be celebrated by Acadians world-wide. After much debate, the Feast of Our Lady of the Assumption, August 15, was selected as "National Day of the Acadians".

Their purpose was furthered this year by this first celebration in St. Martinville which was attended by several hundred persons from Texas, Mississippi and Louisiana, all joined in spirit by Acadian cousins in Canada and in France.
